St Mary's Church, Edlesborough

Options for the residents of Edlesborough. Which shall it be? <u>Dateline February 2050</u>



The landscape of Edlesborough has changed forever. Following the collapse of the church roof it was determined that the cost of repairs was not justified as hardly anyone has used the church in the past 30 years. Visitors come mainly to trace their ancestors in the churchyard. Visitors to the church itself numbered less than 50 each year. There is no use of the church by the residents other than the school carol service once a year. As a result of the roof collapse the walls and tower of the church were deemed unsafe and were taken down. The church that stood towering over Edlesborough for over 800 years is no more.

<u>Or</u> Dateline February 2050



Thanks to the 'Friends of St Mary's Church Edlesborough' the church that was declared redundant by the Church of England towards the end of the last century is now a thriving centre for community activities. Since the setting up of the 'Friends' group in 2012 there were significant changes to the church facilities in the years following to make it a more usable space. The installation of toilets, replacing the pews with padded chairs and the provision of background heating has made it a very versatile space for concerts, art exhibitions, dances and other activities requiring a large space. The solutions found for car parking have made it a

much more accessible building.

The Heritage Centre in the church attracts a large number of people from all over the country. The opening of the church tower to allow tourists to gain a fantastic view of the surroundings has proved very popular and is another valuable source of income.

The lighting of the church at night makes the church stand out like a beacon over the Vale of Aylesbury and continues to shine and grabs the attention of people far and wide.

The future for St Mary's Edlesborough looks secure for the future. Having stood over Edlesborough for over 800 years it looks set for centuries to come!



Christmas is a distant memory, we've welcomed in 2012 with fireworks, the post Christmas credit card statement has arrived and this year's resolutions to exercise more, reduce alcohol and food consumption are beginning to fail. Let's be positive. The Romans and the Celts considered February the beginning of spring when the days lengthen, snowdrops, primroses and bluebells begin to appear, despite total neglect, brightening the hedgerows. Birds are building their nests and gardeners are planning, sowing or nurturing seedlings. This is a month to look forward and there is much to look forward to. 

Last - But No Means Least – Dagnall's Village Sign is Unveiled



The Rt. Hon John Bercow MP was once again welcomed by the EDaN Beautification Team to unveil their third village sign in the parish of Edlesborough, this time in the picturesque village of Dagnall, nestling at the foot of the downs. This last sign, designed by team member Megan Howells and again crafted by Signs of the Times in Tebworth

and RS Engineering in Stanbridge, depicts the Edlesborough rose brass - originating from 1412 - plums and straw plaiting, overlooked by a red kite and the Whipsnade lion, all these uniting the three villages.

All Saints Church stands proudly in the top picture and the Red Lion (now, happily, open again!) sits at the bottom, lorded over by a magnificent stag – no doubt escaped from nearby Ashridge woods. Walkers taking a close look at the sign will notice our flying pig, wearing a straw boater – locals will appreciate the significance of this! Front and centre is placed Dagnall's war memorial, a reminder of the ultimate sacrifices

made by our local lads, lest we forget.

The cold December day dawned bright for the small team of helpers involved with placing the very heavy pictorial sign on the post erected a few weeks earlier and the sun continued to shine on the proceedings throughout the day. Dagnall Community Choir met at the pub where new landlords Ali and Martin provided mulled punch and nibbles and we had a quick rehearsal, led by our charismatic choirmaster Stuart Harding - almost raising the ancient roof with our enthusiasm. Nicely warmed up, we walked over to the new sign, surrounded by a

beautiful circular hardwood bench. Villagers (and Father Christmas!) joined in with the choir's carol singing, then Christine Yates welcomed John Bercow – who was feeling extremely poorly with a bad chest – and invited him to unveil the village sign, promising him that this time it would fall away easily – Northall's had to be unhitched by the long arm of the law!.

As always John did us proud, determined not to let us down despite feeling so bad and

the sign was unveiled in all its glory. There are two brass plaques on the bench, one commemorating a dear man, Michael Price, who farmed 1000 acres in Dagnall for over 50 years, lovingly remembered by his widow, Norma; the other for Anne Thompson, who was chair of Edlesborough Parish Council and sadly missed. Both passed away last year and went to school together. The community held a minute's silence.

We all made our way to the village hall where John Ralphs accompanied the choir

on the organ, then Kathy Bovington asked Mr. Speaker to do the honours once again and open the Dagnall School and Under 5's Christmas Fayre. He stayed and enjoyed all the fayre had to offer then made his departure – probably home to bed.

The team have produced notelets depicting all three village signs, again designed by Megan, aided by Jim Wright from the EDaN Steering Group, who replicated it electronically. On the reverse are local places of interest in and around the villages. The inside is left blank for your messages. Profits from the sale of these will help fund future projects. They are on sale in all three village pubs, also Edlesborough Autos and the Post Office - £3.00 for 5 or 75p each. Your support by purchase of these would be much appreciated.

Due to the excessive amount of rubbish either put into the existing bins or left laying on the ground new larger bins have been erected which will still be emptied by the volunteer litter pickers to whom the Parish Council are extremely grateful.

DOG FOULING

Despite several articles having appeared in 'Focus' the whole of the Parish (Edlesborough Dagnall and Northall) is still continually being plagued by dog fouling not only on recreation areas but also along pavements. The Parish Council or Thames Valley Police would appreciate hearing from anyone who may witness any dog fouling not being picked up. A photograph of the dog/owner could lead to that person being prosecuted. Would dog owners please read and take notice of the following:

NOTICE TO ALL DOG OWNERS

It is an offence if your dog fouls on public land and you fail to remove the faeces.

Under the Dogs (Fouling of Land) Act 1996 failure to clean up dog fouling is an offence subject to a maximum fine of £1,000. Local authorities can also give offenders the option of paying a fixed penalty fine of £50 rather than going to court.

What are the health risks associated with dog fouling?

Dog faeces carry harmful infections, the most widely known being Toxocariasis. Human Toxocariasis is potentially a serious infection and is a direct consequence of soil or sand contamination with faeces carrying eggs of the parasite. The parasite can only infect humans if swallowed. Once swallowed, the infection can last between six and 24 months. Frequently the infection is through the hands, but can also be with the dogs themselves or through inanimate objects such as wheels of toys, soles of shoes, etc. Many infected soil samples are found in children's play areas and in the streets and as a result of this, Toxocariasis is mainly found in children between 18 months and five years. Eye disorders are the most commonly reported complaint associated with Toxocariasis, although other symptoms are vague aches, dizziness, nausea, asthma and epileptic fits.

Money Matters!

The congregation at St Mary's has the pleasure of worshipping in a beautiful, medieval, Grade 1 listed building, which will be 800 years old in seven years' time. This building however belongs not just to people who go to church but to all parishioners of the four villages of Eaton Bray, Edlesborough, Northall and Dagnall for whom it is their parish church. It is steeped in history and it is yours to marvel at and enjoy whenever you wish; it is amazing how many people do come into the church for various reasons during any ordinary day.

The down-side of owning such an ancient building however, is that it is very expensive to maintain. The stonework, a soft chalk-like stone originally mined in Totternhoe, requires tens of thousands of pounds to be spent on it every 20-30 years just to stop the building crumbling away. In addition, we have to finance an annual budget of around £80,000 which includes paying a diocesan quota to cover among other things, clergy salaries and pensions.

To meet these commitments, it does mean that we have to think about money rather more than we would wish and to run many fund-raising events throughout the year to pay our bills and save for future renovations; you will no doubt have attended some of them – Carnival, Open Gardens, concerts, Christmas Fayre, to name a few. But what you may not realise is that St Mary's also tries hard to be a generous church. In 2011, for example, St Mary's donated almost £15,000 to charity through events such as Carnival, collections at Christmas Services, Christian Aid concert, Harvest Auction, Poppy Prom, Gordon's Christmas Puzzle and response to natural disasters, plus also the PCC's annual budgeted charitable giving.

If you would like to help decide which charities St Mary's supports in 2012, there will be regular opportunities presented in Focus for you to make recommendations, so in addition to supporting our events, look out for these occasions during the coming year and make your suggestions to the Vicar, Churchwarden or Gordon Gray or via St Mary's website www.stmaryseatonbray.org.uk.

25 Years of South Beds Dial-a-Ride

South Beds Dial-a-Ride was founded on December 1986 and has just celebrated its 25th Anniversary of transporting the elderly and disabled in Luton, Dunstable, Houghton Regis and neighbouring villages. Over 34,000 passenger journeys were undertaken in the last year alone.

Bob Mumford MBE founded the charity after becoming blind and finding it difficult to get out and about. He thought others may be having similar problems. Bob used his experience in the running of a haulage company near Markyate, and followed the model of Guildford Dial-a-Ride which had just been set up. Bob obtained money from local councils which enabled him to buy a second hand minibus and take on a part time driver, and the rest as they say, is history. In 1996 HM the Queen awarded Bob the MBE for services to the disabled.

South Beds Dial-a-Ride runs two Coffee Mornings per year which are attended by up to 60 of its grateful members. At the last one just a few weeks ago, a huge cake

was baked and decorated in the shape of a minibus as part of this special celebration. It can be seen here being cut by Coordinator, Dave Barratt, Brenda Boatwright, Chairman of South Beds Dial-a-Ride for 20 years (a former Dunstable Town Councillor), and Christine Perkins, still Vice-Chairman and daughter of Bob Mumford who has been a committee member since the earliest days and continues to ensure the preservation of her father's memory and ethics.



Use of the Rye Recreation Ground

Eaton Bray Parish Council has been approached by EB Lions, our local junior Football Club, about the possibility of enclosing a small part of the Rye Recreation Ground to build an all-weather training pitch. This would be paid for by EB Lions; the Parish Council would not provide any funding. We need your views on this proposal.



On the plan shown, the proposed location of the proposed facility is to the right of the main football pitch on the Totternhoe Road side (the green is already used for grass football matches and will continue to be so). A larger plan of this design can be found on the parish notice board (Knights Close) and the parish website - www.ebpc.co.uk. Although not shown, the playground area will remain in its current position.

The proposed development is being put forward with the view that the project offers the following benefits to the local community:

- (1) An all-weather facility is important for the local youth football players to allow their training/ coaching to take place throughout the year.
- (2) The facility would be available to the local primary schools to use during the week to support the delivery of the PE curriculum and extra-curricular activities. The shared use of the facility would also strengthen school-club links.
- (3) The provision of an all-weather pitch would reduce wear on the current grass pitches which are being used for training and matches.
- (4) Without a local all-weather pitch facility it is considered that the club's continued development would be hindered.

To hear information on crime issues related to your area, community messaging (also known as Ringmaster) provides free alerts to your inbox or telephone.

By joining you will receive information about crimes and crime reduction advice, appeals for witnesses, police information and meetings all specific to the neighbourhood in which you live or work. You can choose to receive this by email, fax, text or by voice message to your mobile or landline telephone.

It involves the Police, Community Safety departments of local authorities, other voluntary organisations and, above all, individuals and families who want to make their neighbourhoods better places to live.

It is important to be aware of a number of incidents in the district where satellite navigation systems (sat nav) have been stolen from unattended cars. It is important that people are aware that opportunists are out there and how to prevent being a victim of this crime.



Points to consider before leaving your vehicle:

- Never leave a sat nav unattended in your car, always take it with you. This includes taking the cradle attached to the windscreen as thieves will break in to search for the device. If you are in a situation where you are unable to bring the device with you, securely lock the device and cradle out of sight.
- The suction on the cradle often leaves a mark on the windscreen and due to this thieves have been known to break into cars in the hope that there is a sat-nav in the glove box. Due to this it is important to wipe away any suction marks. These devices are still highly desirable items among thieves and they will not hesitate to break into your car.
- Be conscious to park your vehicle in a car park which is well lit, has CCTV surveillance and is a busier area for the public. Quieter, darker and less populated areas are more likely to be an area for thieves to operate.
- Property mark your sat nav with a UV pen and also register the device on www. immobilise.com.

News from the Lions Den

Edlesborough Book Group

Alone in Berlin by Hans Fallada

The novel opens with the delivery of a letter, which proves to be not only a catalyst for its recipients, but the start of a sequence of events which tells the story. It is 1940 and France has surrendered to the German forces; a cause for great rejoicing in the city of Berlin and a reinforcement to the Nazi regime. But the letter, delivered to Otto and Anna Quangel, tells them of the death of their beloved son in that battle. The Quangels live quietly in an apartment block and their lives hitherto have been unremarkable. Otto is a carpenter who having lost his furniture business, now works as a supervisor in a factory which produces coffins. Up until now he has been a loyal supporter of Hitler and has not questioned the actions of the regime: but his wife's cry , "Oh, your Hitler" on learning that her son is dead, galvanises him. He begins to think deeply about what is happening around him and the atmosphere of fear and dread surrounding law abiding citizens such as he. Freedom of expression is a thing of the past and everyone is aware that almost anyone of their neighbours or colleagues could be a Nazi spy, and once reported to the authorities, the repercussions are swift and deadly.

Otto devises a scheme, thinking that if he drops cards bearing subversive messages about Hitler and his regime anonymously around the city, people will pick them up and pass them on. He believes this way, gradually, the dissidents will outnumber the Nazis, and a revolution will be born. Alas his scheme is doomed. Most of the cards are handed in to the authorities, the fear of being thought disloyal to the Nazi party is so great.

Even so, the cards begin to worry the police department and Inspector Escherich is given the task of discovering the identity of the "Hobgoblin", as he is nicknamed. Starting out with great confidence, the Inspector finds his own position in danger as he fails to bring the writer of the cards to justice. Although the fate of the Quangels is inevitable, the author has involved us very cleverly with all the characters, and we are anxious to find out how their stories end.

Hans Fallada, is the nom de plume of Rudolf Ditzen, whose own story makes fascinating reading. His troubled life, with his addictions and mental problems, led him to numerous incarcerations; but his ability as a writer is beyond question. Alone in Berlin gives us an insight into the moral dilemmas faced by ordinary people in extraordinary times. A very powerful and involving book, that stays in the mind long after reading.


My very small contribution to help declare your feelings is a few culinary ideas that will not cost you much, but are infallible. They range here from the obvious and easy to more subtle ones:


Eaton Bray Lawn Tennis Club

(THE FIRST 25 YEARS 1987 - 2012)

Initially the idea of some forward thinking ladies in 1986, the inaugural meeting to form the Eaton Bray Tennis Club was held in the Coffee Tayern on 13th January 1987.

In March the following year the Chairman's report indicated that 60 households were members of the Tennis Club and affiliation to the Lawn Tennis Association had been requested. To raise the necessary

On August Bank Holiday 1989 the first ever Club Championships took place. In 2011 we held our 23rd Finals. Our participation in the South Bedfordshire Tennis Leagues, which progressed from the entry of a couple of men's teams in the Bedfordshire league in the 1990ies, has continued to the present time.

In 1998 with the aid of a Lottery Grant we managed to organise the building of a Clubhouse & in 2001, having received planning permission from South Bedfordshire District Council for the erection of floodlights, we set about the daunting task of raising the necessary finance for floodlights to 2 of the courts & for the cleaning & re-painting of all 3 courts.

On Friday 21st March 2003 the floodlights were "christened" just ahead of the advancement of the clocks & with the courts cleaned & painted the expenditure totalled 23K. In this instance we were unable to obtain assistance from the Lottery and the work was predominantly self-financed but we received valued support & financial help from the Eaton Bray Parish Council

In the first complete season following the introduction of floodlights Eaton Bray Men's A Team were First Division Champions in the South Bedfordshire League which was a great achievement considering the size of other clubs in the Luton & Dunstable area. The Ladies team also ended as champions of Division 2.

In 2006 the structure of the courts was disintegrating and major sub strata & resurfacing work was necessary. Again the ingenuity & dedication of members helped raise the 31K needed to ensure the continued existence of the Club. Every avenue of grant awards was explored and some members parted with 5 years of advance subscriptions to meet the expenditure target.

The following year the 3rd court was resurfaced at a cost of 17K

The constant level of expenditure is a clear indication of the ongoing need for continuous income year after year after year.

Now, 25 years on from the start, members have come & members have gone. Through all of the changes a small number of people, who were either at that Coffee Tavern meeting in 1987 or joined in the following couple of years, remain involved with Eaton Bray Tennis Club. This band has been augmented by new members who have also contributed to the continuing success of the Club - an indication that a solid base giving stability and continuity is required along with the regular transfusion of new blood to keep the Tennis Club as a valuable asset to its members and to the community. Eaton Bray can be justifiably proud of its Tennis Club as the Club is proud to be in

Eaton Bray.

By the time this article is printed we will have held our Annual General Meeting at Dunstable Cricket Club, with a new Chair-person to guide the Club, hopefully, on our journey toward our Golden Anniversary.

On November 14th Years 3 and 4 were visited by some Romans from Legion XIIII. We all dressed up as Romans so that we could immerse ourselves in our Roman experience. We spent the morning learning about Roman daily life, Roman history and about Roman Britain. 

November was another dry month with only 30mm of rain. Temperature were again above average, taking the "mean temperature" to 9.9° c, a big increase on the November 2010 average of 4.4° c.


December was the wettest month of the year but we were still down 15% on the five-year average. It was also an unusually mild month. The temperature only dropped to below zero on three days and then only briefly. The mean temperature was 4.9°c for Dagnall, and the Met Office confirmed December 2011 was the second warmest December on record. This contrasts to the previous year when December saw a daily mean temperature of -5.5°c and, on the coldest day (20/12/10), temperatures dropped to -13.5.

2011 was an overall dry and mild year with no very low or very high temperatures, but generally but warmer than average with a mean temperature rising from 8.8°c to 10.6°c
