Chairman's Statement AGM 2013

In my report at the last AGM, I was reporting on a record year and also falling bookings during the current year. At that time we had undertaken to review our presence on the web and to look at our advertising policy. Having added some extra advertising, the bookings took off again during the latter half of the year. We are not convinced that our actions caused the increase but by the end of December we were less than £600 down on 2011. A very successful outcome during these difficult times. Along with keeping costs down we have had another successful year.

Although we had hoped to finish the car park by the end of 2012, as we all know, this was not possible due to a difference of opinion with our contractor. Finally after much persuasion by us, sense prevailed and the job was completed to the original specification. This also had the effect of inflating our reserves, as we have paid for the car park in the 2013 accounts.

This brings to an end our original list of refurbishments. It has been a wonderful achievement for a small group to bring about, involving planning, fundraising and supervising each part of the works.

We look forward with confidence that the hall has a very bright future and will be part of village life for many years.

The trustees have created a development fund reserve, with which, it is hoped that current and future trustees will be able to maintain the hall in its present or even better condition than it is now. We hope this reserve will help pay for new fire exit doors within 2013 and further projects over the next few years, without doing major fund raising.

The primary purpose of this fund is to maintain the hall in a good working order. Our boilers are now nearly 10 years old and the floor in the main hall is starting to show signs of wear. Our chairs will also need replacing in the foreseeable future.

It is these and many unforeseen things, which our reserves will allow the trustees to maintain and help the hall to keep its reputation as a good venue to hire and allow the trustees to face the future with confidence.

My thanks to you all.

It's been two years six months since I was licensed as Priest in Charge to the Benefice of Eaton Bray with Edlesborough and about a year later I became the Vicar. I have walked all the footpaths many times, been to 100's of coffee mornings, officiated at innumerable weddings and funerals and met so many lovely people that I thank God for calling me to this place.

At St Mary's, work with children and families is developing. TOTS on the 2nd and 4th Tuesdays of the month and Messy Church on the 1st Sunday of the month at 3pm are both great fun and an opportunity to learn about Jesus in an informal way. On Tuesday 27th August there will be Messy Church at St Mary's from 2pm with games outside if the sun is shining and heaps of activities. 

Not exactly a haul worth risking a few weeks in a young offender's institution, I'd have thought. Last time, they went off empty handed with the exception of a small trophy, which was later found ceremoniously dumped. What absurdity.

I say 'young' because, as often happens, people pull together in situations like this and ask questions, put out 'feelers', and with the help of Bedfordshire Police, a certain young individual, whom we'd love to name but can't, will probably by now have had a visit from the uniformed branch, to be given some advice on how normal people behave, how not to throw his life prospects away so soon, and to decide the next steps. I guess the lesson we learn from this is the need to be constantly vigilant around our homes, possessions and organisations. We'd like

to ask for everyone's help in this, let's all keep an eye out for one another, whether it be our houses, cars or tennis clubs. If you see anything suspicious, question it, or report it. We should always keep ourselves away from potential threat, but vigilance costs nothing and can be the best deterrent. Burglars don't like to be seen breaking the law, they might get caught. And there's usually a prize waiting for them, involving a nice room for 23 hours a day.

Finally, a big thank you to those members who have given up their Sundays to repair the roof, cut down the shrubs and build a new fence at the back of the clubhouse. David Provan and John Jones in particular

have been magnificent. Other deterrents are currently being considered for early installation

If you have recently fallen victim to a scam call Action Fraud on 0300 123 2040. Residents can sign up for Scam Alerts, please visit the CBC website and go onto the Scam Alert pages for more details.

Bedfordshire Police

There have been 7 reported crimes for May: 1x violence against a person, 1x sexual offence, 1x domestic burglary, 1x vehicle crime, 1x theft, 2x criminal damage. In addition there have been 18 reported incidents of anti-social behavior (ASB): 1x

Confessions of a Local Postman Taken from Landscapes & Lives by Shaun Haydon

For many people, the opportunity for a friendly word with the local postman is a cheery start to the day. Some older village residents were kind enough to extend this chat further, and pass on some recollections of days gone by to give another flavour of village life.

"Before he abdicated in 1936, King Edward VIII was known to hunt in the area, and was seen hunting on at least one occasion on The Meads."

"30-odd people, some from Slapton and surrounding villages rode bikes to and from the nurseries. There used to be a gate that came out in School Lane. A hooter used to go off at 12 o'clock, 1 o'clock, and 5 o'clock; at these times, it was like a sea of bikes and people. The nursery trade practically kept Stanbridgeford station open."

"Fred Dickens, the village constable, apprehended one particular wrong-doer, then stopped George Cook the farmer on his tractor to get him to put this person on his trailer. George transported him to the police house, from where they rang Linslade station to come and take him in." "Jacko (Jack Cook) the roadman used to take his cart around the village and empty the drains with something like a big ladle with a long handle - they were never blocked. Jack only did the village and, by the time he got all the way round to do all the drains, it would have taken a fortnight, and then he would start again."

"A man with a horse and cart always stopped at the Chequers for a drink. While he was in the pub, some 15/16-year-old lads would unhitch the horse and put that on one side of the fence, the cart on the other side, then hitch them back up. They would then hide and wait for the man to

come out after a few drinks and try to drive off."

"Before the war, they were putting a water pipe line in Edlesborough High St. and one of the Irish workers was shouting about sorting out the village policeman. The policeman got wind of this, so came along and hit him with his truncheon, then left him there. When he was biking past the next morning, he said 'you're not quite so bright this morning!"

"Sid Hazard wore half-leg trousers on braces and lived in cottages by the Baptist Chapel in Edlesborough. He used to go round with a tray round his neck selling bloaters, calling out 'Bloaters, lovely Bloaters'"

"One chap was always known for having a clay pipe in his mouth and working on his allotment at Bower Lane. He was courting a lady who lived down Summerleys, and they were both in their 80s. She moved to Dunstable, so he used to travel by bus to see her. The return fare used to be 9d, then they put it up to 10d return. He wouldn't pay that and said 'I'm not paying 10d return, I only pay 6d each way'."

"Playing cricket in Slapton, they used to have to clear cows out of the meadow, and cut out a pitch to play. If anyone took a big swing, they would run like mad to get the ball and then stand pondering. Some would throw it straight back mixed with cow dung."

"Italian prisoners of war used to clear the brooks. They also made baskets from the willow bushes to sell."

"Just before the wash brook on the road towards Totternhoe, there used to be hen houses owned by Mark Bates. During the war, land girls were employed there. One villager is known to have met her husband through that connection."

"Italian prisoners of war used to clear the brooks. They also made baskets from the willow bushes to sell"

"Mr Grant of Slicketts Lane had a gasrun car. It had an inflatable mattress-like tent at the back, the only one known in the village."

"Mrs Tearle lived down Summerleys and used to cook faggots in her parlour to sell them for ½ d. Her son Aubrey used to be the cricket umpire."

"Tommy Proctor smoked a clay pipe and used to keep hay in his shoes to keep his feet warm"

"Kate George had a shop called Herbal & Sweets at the end of Booth Place, on the left hand side as you go up. You could buy Brimstone for 1d to make your Brimstone and Treacle for upset stomachs."

"Soft drinks, cigarettes and newspapers were sold at the Coffee Tayern - the

"green 'un" sports newspaper used to be available each Saturday night."

"There used to be three milkmen in the village, Gurneys of High St, Scott of Park Lane, and Holmes of Green Lane."

"During the war, school was half days because the evacuees used to do either mornings or afternoons and the village children alternated with them."

"Soldiers were billeted to where Knights Close is now. Search lights were stationed along The Baulk."

"Once a year, there was a fair in Knights Close meadow. The circus used to come to the field at the bottom of Church Lane." "There was a large shed at The Chequers pub where they used to keep the bus, the last bus returning there at night, and leaving from there first thing in the morning. It is recalled that Harry Holman may have been a driver, and Fred Holland a conductor."

Edlesborough W.I.

When we last met we listened to a really interesting report from our representative at the recent A.G.M. of National W.I., held in Cardiff. It had obviously been a very impressive occasion, especially to hear "Jerusalem" sung by such a large number of ladies. This is always a moving experience for those attending.

Our speaker was Malcolm Singer, a baritone concert singer. (What an appropriate surname!). He has lived in Luton since 1943, when he was three years old. His interest in music began at eight years of age when he joined a church choir. A few years later he became a member of a group which performed plays and music. Singing lessons followed, and he even went to the Austrian Tyrol for a two weeks' course in yodelling. After this, Malcolm became a full-time student at the Royal Academy of

Music, and twice a week he studied opera. He has sung in a few operas, worked with a touring company and sung in concerts, some of which have been broadcast. He is, however, known mainly as a concert singer.

Malcolm amused us by recounting some of the 'disasters' which have occurred during his singing career. This has involved performers not turning up, a long power cut during a vital rehearsal and an unexpected telephone call, asking him to appear on stage in a couple of hours, when miles from the venue. Also, mishaps can occur during the performance, when those on stage have to 'carry on regardless'.

It is obvious how much Malcolm loves his work. He described it as singing lovely music in beautiful buildings. What a fantastic life he has.

Doctors Descend on Village Carnival

After a slow start to the summer a gorgeous, cloudless sky brought record numbers to the St. Mary's Village Carnival. The theme of the Carnival was Science Fiction and floats and village houses were decorated with Doctor Who. Star Trek. Star Wars. Toy Story and a whole range of robots and monsters; some not in fancy dress! Winners of procession floats in different categories were Edlesborough School Totternhoe School and 1st Eaton Bray and Edlesborough Scouts - Aliens in Underpants and Dr Who proved to be popular themes. Winners of best dressed houses were 130 High Street, Eaton Bray, and 23 The Green, Edlesborough. Eaton Bray, in particular, was ablaze with colour – most houses had put up the bunting for which many thanks. Winner of the weekend for two in Rome went to Mrs Smith from Northall - ves. those generous people from Northall who have been bereft of prizes for a few years, were at last rewarded with a number of prizes including the big one! (Thank you for your kind welcome and generosity once again.)

Starting at 6.30am on Saturday morning a small army of unseen volunteers begin to descend on Edlesborough Green to transform the quiet playing field into one of the biggest independent village Carnivals in the country. By midday, tents and marquees had been raised, stalls were in place, breakfasts had been served and people gathered for the arrival of the Carnival procession. At the end of the day many of the same volunteers packed the equipment back onto lorries and vans, litter was removed and the Green returned to its original state.

The Carnival procession was led by "Revelation" and "Shooting Stars"

majorette troupes, to a stunning soundtrack of well-known science fiction themes and surrounded by local scouts collecting buckets of coins from onlookers and by many others who followed on foot dressed as characters from science fiction classics; the presence of Darth Veda and an accompanying Storm Trooper received particular cheers.

The crowds began to gather just after midday well before the Carnival procession arrived, to get an early look at over 120 stalls present this year and a selection of fairground rides that grows year on year. The "Meteor" or rotating "Wall of Death" became a particular landmark throughout the day as it rose and fell with the accompanying screams of joy riders. 

2012 was the centenary of the birth of Elizabeth Taylor, an author, who for most of her married life, lived in Penn, Buckinghamshire. As she had received a lot of press and radio coverage and was unfamiliar to most of us, a group member suggested that we should read Mrs Palfrey at the Claremont. It was written in 1971 and is set in West London in the 1960's. It describes very accurately a world already fast disappearing; one of faded gentility, struggling to keep up appearances.

The book begins with Mrs Palfrey arriving by taxi to live at the Claremont Hotel. A rather shabby, once rather grand establishment in South Kensington. Newly widowed and with a daughter living far away in Scotland, she has realised that she can no longer live independently. London, she feels, is full of life and activities and will keep her busy. What she has failed to take into consideration, is the speed and harshness of London life and her own increasing frailty. The Claremont hotel with its rigid routine and scant regard for the comfort of its residents, soon becomes rather stifling. There are four other residents, three elderly widows and one man, Mr Osmond, who is regarded with some distaste. At first Mrs Palfrey tries to seek approval in order to fit in, buying knitting needles and wool and joining with the apres dinner TV lounge activity. It becomes obvious to the reader however. that she is of a different class and will always be an observer of, rather than a member of the group.

One day, returning from an errand to the Public Library, she falls badly and is rescued by Ludo, a young bohemian failed actor, who is now struggling to become a writer. In gratitude for his kindness. Mrs Palfrey invites him to dinner, whereupon he is mistaken for Desmond, her grandson. She has spoken of Desmond often, but as vet he has never visited his grandmother. Mrs Palfrey persuades Ludo to carry on with this harmless charade and is secretly thrilled by the deception and the unfamiliar intrigue in her life. Initially, Ludo thinks of her and the residents of the hotel as source material for a novel, but gradually their relationship changes and their story evolves into a gentle and loving friendship.

This is a beautifully written and sharply observed novel, mainly an essay on age and the isolation and anonymity it brings. Something which everyone will have to face and will deal with differently, but nonetheless frightening. This book is a sad one and is not easy to read if one is old. The excellence of the writing and observations of character, together with the descriptions of Kensington make it a rewarding experience. We intend to read more of Elizabeth Taylor's work.

Symphonic First for St Mary's

For the first time in its almost 800 year history, St Mary's Church, Eaton Bray, played host to a full symphony orchestra. The performance, given by the Luton Symphony Orchestra, took place on 22nd June as part of the 60th season of annual subscription concerts.

Under the direction of conductors Uwe Radok and Dafydd Billinghurst the capacity audience enjoyed a varied programme of music.

The Rossini overture *Il Signor Bruschino*, played by the full orchestra, was a sparkling and dramatic opening to the concert which was followed by the equally lively *Petite Symphonie for Winds* by Charles Gounod. The Intricate interplay between the different instruments of the wind section, assisted by the horns, was much appreciated by the audience.

The string section introduced music of a more serious and sombre tone. Their rendering of Purcell's great G minor *Chacony* was full of vigour and rhythmic contrasts while the wonderful *Adagio for* Strings by Samuel Barber produced a more reflective, but intense, sound from the players. To complete the first half, the whole orchestra joined together again to play a suite of movements taken from Bizet's opera *Carmen*. Dramatic, lyrical and joyous by turn, this gave all sections of the orchestra an opportunity to shine and sent the audience into the interval in a positive mood.

The second half of the concert contained only one piece, *Symphony no.5* by Franz Schubert. A piece full of memorable tunes and sudden changes with an especially beautiful slow movement, it provided an uplifting conclusion to a concert that was enjoyed by performers and audience alike. It would be nice to think that it will not be too long before the Luton Symphony Orchestra returns, perhaps as part of next season's concerts.





Bits and Pieces. Information. Knowledge. Something for everyday. "And, Thou, Lord, in the beginning hast laid the foundation of the earth; and the heavens are the work of thine hands. Hebrews 1: 10. Money will buy a bed, but not sleep; books, but not brains; food, but not appetite; finery, but not beauty; a house, but not a home; medicine, but not health; luxuries, but not culture; amusements, but not happiness.

Which reminds us that there are still things in life which are free! A "fishy" story. An angler hooked a large pike - and threw it back. He then caught a beautiful trout - and threw that back too. Next he landed a tiny perch, grunted with satisfaction and took it home, Why did he keep the little one? Answer: because he only had a small frying pan! groan, groan!

A child was misbehaving and after a while the mother said, "Behave, how do you expect to get into heaven if you act like that?" The child thought for a moment and then replied. "I shall just run in and out and keep slamming the door until they say, "For goodness sake, either come in or stay out. And then I'll go in!".

Weather wisdom - "If St. Bartholomews (August 24th) be clear, a prosperous Autumn comes that year. Fair on September first, fair for the month.September blows soft, - Till the fruit's in the loft.

Under the summer sun, the crops in the fields change to a deeper, golden-brown as they ripen and it is harvest-time again. We will soon be celebrating in our churches, chapels and the Salvation Army Hall. Both the Jewish and Christian faiths overflow with harvests. The book of Deuteronomy commands the Israelites to celebrate. They were to bring samples of their best corn, fruit and stock to the altar and to thank God for their fields and pastures. This "harvest home"

was called the "Feast of the Tabernacles". These ancient people, unlike us, had three harvests each year, but this was the greatest, and most important.

The origin of the word harvest is obscure. We come closest to it when we say, that we crop what was rooted.

Some people today do not realise the relevance of Harvest. The nearest they come to it is to buy an organic loaf of bread. Yet they go to County shows and revere the tools of the old ways of working the land; the vehicles, tythe barns, implements, collectibles. We go to the supermarkets and purchase fruit and vegetables, whatever the season of the year, but do we ever think of the calloused hands and aching backs, anxious faces and sighs, that go into the production of these "goodies"? We are happy to sing "We plough the fields and scatter...." but when did we?

May we never take for granted the abundance of the earths riches, and those who labour throughout the seasons to provide these for us. Now here is a recipe for a "pudden" you might like to try.

"You do peel sum pares and cut them up in 4 peaces to each pare, then put sum peaces of bred and butter in the bottom of a deep dish, and lay the pares on top. Then more bred and butter, throwing on sum sugger and a pinch of cynamon. Then you do take 4 egges and beat them hard for a bit, then put them in a measure of milke and beat up till frothie. Now pour over the pudden in the dish and cook it gentle for a hower by the clocke."

A recipe from 1796. So celebrate and be thankful for the seasons of the year; the blessings and joys of harvest time and when the time comes that we are gathered to the heavenly harvest may the fruits of our lives be pleasing to God the Father.

Weather Conditions for June 2013



This Does Not Affect Your Statutory Rights

Jonathan Vernon Smith is the Sony Award winning midmorning show presenter for

BBC Three Counties Radio. During his consumer hour he helps listeners with their consumer problems and now shares his advice with you.

One of the greatest myths concerning consumer rights, is that after a year, the retailer no longer has any obligation to you. What drives me utterly bonkers is that this myth is so often perpetuated by THE RETAILER!

I lose track of the number of times I have taken a call from a frantic consumer on my radio show saying "I bought a vacuum cleaner/tv/computer. It has broken, but because it's 14 months old, the shop says there's nothing they can do. After 12 months they don't have to do anything". I prefer to think it's down to ignorance, rather than a conscious desire to mislead the customer that makes them fob people off in this way.

When you purchase any brand new goods or services in the UK you are protected by your 'statutory rights' (sale of goods act 1979).

All goods must be:

- a) Fit for purpose
- b) Of 'reasonable' quality (based on the cost)
- c) Last for a reasonable amount of time (based on the cost)

Therefore, if you buy (for example) a TV for £600, it should last for a 'reasonable' amount of time. I would suggest a minimum of 5 years worth of 'reasonable use' (3 hours a day) before it blows up. If it develops a manufacturing fault at any time during that period, the retailer IS LIABLE! Any attempt to fob you

off, should be met with a firm, but polite explanation of your consumer rights.

For the first 6 months after purchase, it's up to the retailer to prove that the fault with the item is NOT their responsibility. After the first 6 months it's your responsibility. Therefore, my advice when dealing with an obstructive retailer, is to obtain an independent report to confirm that the product has a manufacturing fault, then ask the retailer to not only fix the problem, but also reimburse you for the cost of the report.

So, remember next time the manager of a shop says "oh sorry, it's 14 months old, there's nothing we can do I'm afraid", tell them you understand your statutory rights and if they STILL fail to help, then call my team on 01582 637450 and I'll have a polite 'word' for you!
