Every day of the year, Central Bedfordshire Council provides services to your community.

All of us will make use of some of these services, whether they are road maintenance, waste collection or the social care services that protect our vulnerable children and adults.

However, providing these services is an expensive business. Central Bedfordshire Council spends more than £180 million a year delivering these services.

Looking ahead, we know there will be less Government grant available for the council than there has been in the past, as the efforts to tackle the national deficit continue. There are also increasing pressures on some of the services we provide because of increasing needs and rising costs.

Central Bedfordshire Council are continually striving to provide value for money. We've achieved savings of more than £20 million already from reviewing what we do and how we work. This year we must save another £19m and expect further reductions in the next financial year.

Taking all these factors into consideration, the council is preparing a financial strategy for the next four years - and we want your views to be at the heart of our plans.

Your council tax pays for public services provided by Central Bedfordshire Council. Last year the government announced that local councils would receive a 28% cut in government grant over the next four years. This means, like many other councils across the country, Central Bedfordshire Council needs to reduce its spending. Last year the council proposed a budget which saved £19million but did not raise council tax. For 2012/13 the Council anticipates needing to reduce spending by a further £10million.
