\*Note: Exception Site Housing' relates to housing specifically for local people with a strong connection to the parish such as having been born there, working there, having lived there for many years, having moved away less than five years ago after living there for many years, or being a carer for someone who lives there (such as a parent/grandparent/brother/sister). It is small scale housing (usually 8-10 units maximum) built to blend in with existing buildings. They can be purely rented or shared ownership properties, or a site with a combination of both. This can only go ahead if there is strong evidence of local need and local support such as that proved through the Housing Needs Surveys and requires the support of the parish council and the borough/district council to go ahead. Also there are conditions placed upon it to ensure it remains as housing for local people into the future. If there is ever a situation whereby there are no longer people within the parish requiring the houses, the properties are allocated to people in need from neighbouring parishes. They are allocated to people on housing waiting lists who have specified that they wish to remain in their own parish.
